RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

All programs and memberships are for Scarsdale residents only unless noted otherwise. A resident is a person residing on a property on which the dwelling unit is partly or completely located in the boundaries of the Village of Scarsdale. The Department obtains a residency listing from the Board of Education resident census. If your name does not appear in this listing, proof of residency will be required. New Residents must present their rental agreement or closing contract for proof of residency in order to register for programs or memberships.

MEMBERSHIP CARD SYSTEM

Residents who wish to use our pool, tennis, and platform tennis facilities must purchase a membership or permit and obtain a photo I.D. card. Photo I.D. cards are available at the Recreation Department office located at Supply Building, 244 Heathcote Road, 2nd floor.

Important: If you received a new photo I.D. card after 2011, you do not need a new card, and you can renew your membership online.
Lost I.D. Cards: There is a \$10 fee to reprint a card.

REFUND POLICY

The policy of the Recreation Department is to issue refunds only for serious illness or calamity in the immediate family, or when the Department cancels a program. When a refund is given, a processing fee will be deducted to cover administrative and registration costs. **Refund request forms must be received prior to start of a program to be considered by the Superintendent of the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Conservation.**

REGISTRATION

Program and membership registration may be completed online at www.scarsdale.gov/recreation or in person at the Recreation Department office at Supply Building, 244 Heathcote Road, 2nd floor. We will not accept registration by phone, mail, or fax. Program registration WILL NOT be accepted at the onsite location of the program for any reason.

Please note: Some programs may have limited registration availability, which is determined on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration deadlines may be placed on some programs.

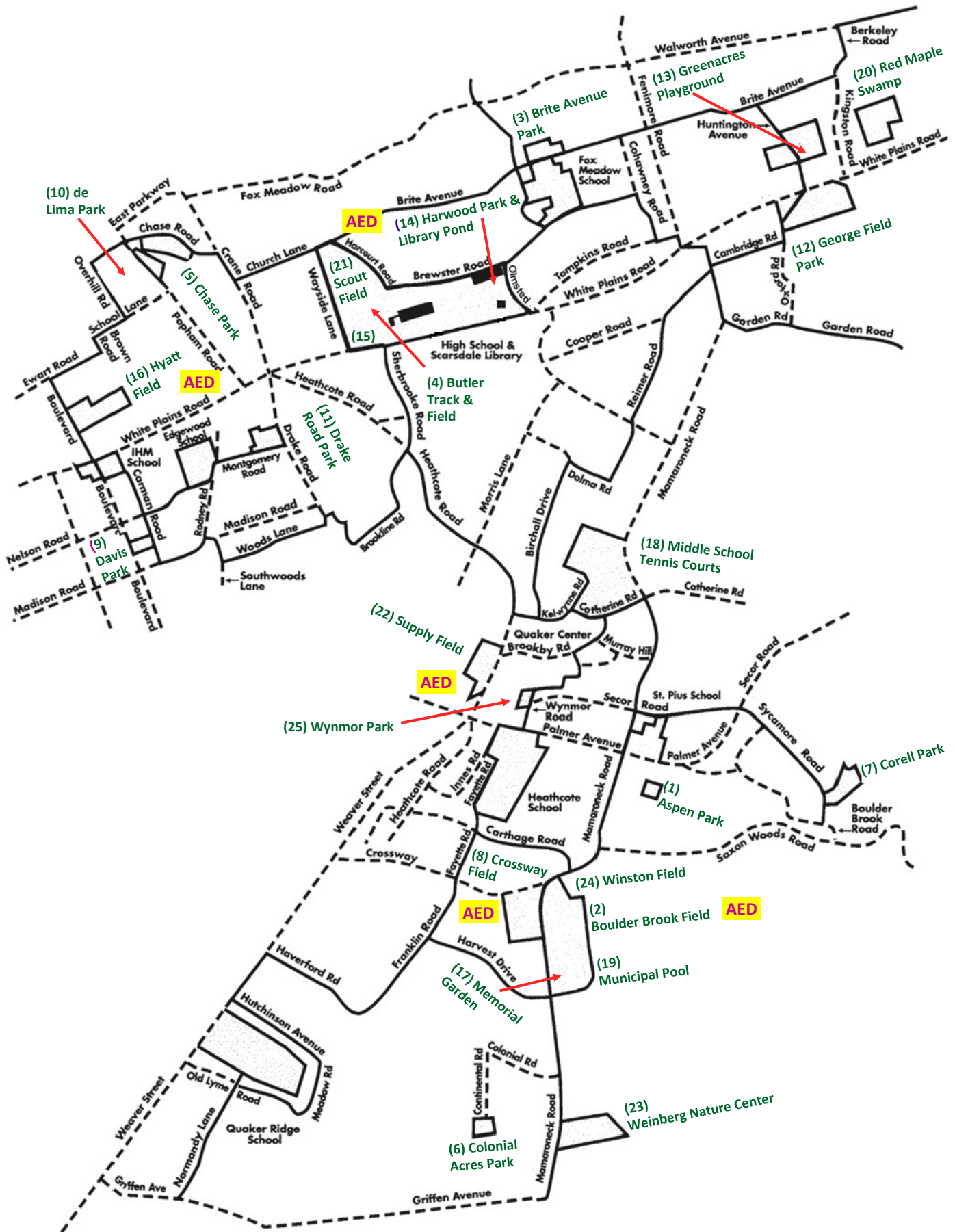

Built in 1952 on 1.6 acres. Neighborhood playground and a small field.
- 2. Boulder Brook Field - 293 Mamaroneck Rd.**
Built in 1984 on 6.1 acres. One large athletic field.
- 3. Brite Avenue Park - 74 Brite Ave.**
Built in 1952 on 2.6 acres. Four tennis courts, three platform tennis courts, tennis practice wall, and warming hut with bathroom. Phone: 914-723-9525
- 4. Butler Track & Field - 62 Wayside Ln.**
Lighted, all-weather walking/running track and athletic field, owned and operated by the school district.
- 5. Chase Park - 32 Chase Rd.**
Acquired 1931 to 1960 on 1.8 acres. Open space with picnic tables and park terrace.
- 6. Colonial Acres Park - 40 Black Hawk Rd.**
Built in 1947 on 1.1 acres. Small ballfield and playground equipment.
- 7. Corell Park - 90 Corell Rd.**
Built in 1957 on 3.8 acres. Small ballfield, basketball area, and playground equipment.
- 8. Crossway Field - 312 Mamaroneck Rd.**
Built in 1946 and 1950 on 18.2 acres. Three ball fields, four athletic fields, five tennis courts, playground, and building with bathroom. Phone: 914-574-6568
- 9. Davis Park - 198 Lyons Rd.**
Built in 1927 on 1.4 acres. Neighborhood playground and open field.
- 10. de Lima Park - 61 Popham Rd.**
Built in 1970 on 1 acre. Open field.
- 11. Drake Road Park - 34 Drake Rd.**
Built between 1968-1970 on 4 acres. Small field and undeveloped area.
- 12. George Field Park - 1218 Post Rd.**
Built in 1928 on 10 acres. Open field and undeveloped area.
- 13. Greenacres Playground - 41 Huntington Ave.**
Built in 1979. Neighborhood playground.
- 14. Harwood Park & Library Pond - 56 Olmsted Rd.**
Acquired in 1928 on 10.9 acres. Passive park, pond, and seating and walking paths.
- 15. High School - 62 Wayside Ln.**
Built in 1919 on 24.1 acres. 10 tennis courts (four Har-Tru, six all weather), and three platform tennis courts. Phone: 914-574-6536
- 16. Hyatt Field - 143-167 Grand Blvd.**
Built in 1949 and 1952 on 5.1 acres. Large ballfield, small ballfield, basketball courts, playground, and exercise equipment.
- 17. Memorial Garden - 311 Mamaroneck Rd.**
Built in 1967 on over one acre of land. Memorials to various wars can be found, with an open field in the center for reflection and remembrance.
- 18. Middle School Tennis Courts - 134 Mamaroneck Rd.**
Built in 1984 on land leased from the Board of Education. Six all-weather tennis courts. 914-574-6572
- 19. Municipal Pool - 311 Mamaroneck Rd.**
Built in 1967 on 7.6 acres. A four-pool complex with bathhouses, concession stand, playground, sand volleyball court, and basketball court. Phone: 914-722-1292
- 20. Red Maple Swamp - 17 Valley Rd.**
Built in 1940 on 5.4 acres. Nature Trail.
- 21. Scout Field - 37 Wayside Ln.**
Part of Butler Field. Senior Citizen (Girl Scout House). Large ballfield, croquet course, and Willow playground.
- 22. Supply Field - 244 Heathcote Rd.**
Built in 1961 on 3.4 acres. Two ballfields, storage building, and batting cages.
- 23. Weinberg Nature Center - 455 Mamaroneck Rd.**
Built in 1958 on 7.7 acres. Environmental education programs, special events, and trails. Phone: 914-722-1289
- 24. Winston Field - 289 Mamaroneck Rd.**
Built in 1984 on 3.1 acres. One large athletic field and two ballfields.
- 25. Wynmor Park - 24 Secor Rd.**
Built in 1926 on .89 acres. One tennis court and small field.

RECREATION LEAGUE INFORMATION

HOW IT WORKS – RECREATION LEAGUE FAQ

HOW ARE YOUTH RECREATION SPORT LEAGUES ORGANIZED?

The Scarsdale Parks, Recreation and Conservation Department (SPRC) works cooperatively with the local Neighborhood Athletic Associations (NAA) to organize the recreation sport leagues.

WHAT IS THE NEIGHBORHOOD ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION (NAA)?

The NAA is made up of volunteer adults residing in each elementary school neighborhood who serve as liaisons between the SPRC and Scarsdale residents regarding youth sport leagues. League questions should be directed to your NAA chairperson. Please refer to page 9, Youth Recreation Sport League, for contact information. The NAA is responsible for player evaluations (when necessary), coach assignments, and team roster organization.

HOW DO I REGISTER FOR A YOUTH RECREATION SPORT LEAGUE?

1. Register online at www.scarsdale.com/recreation or at the SPRC Office in Supply Building on 244 Heathcote Rd. You MUST register by the deadline as team rosters and schedules need to be set in advance.
2. Wait to be contacted by your NAA chairperson or coach. They will inform you of your team and practice schedule. All league information and schedules will be available on the SPRC website at www.scarsdale.gov/recreation.

HOW DO I VOLUNTEER AS A COACH?

Contact your local NAA chairperson to volunteer. A list of NAA presidents can be found on page 9.

ARE UNIFORMS PROVIDED?

The SPRC will provide T-shirts or sports jerseys for all participants in the Youth Recreation Leagues. These shirts may be used as uniforms for the season.

WHAT ARE INDEPENDENT SPORT ORGANIZATIONS (ISO'S) OR TRAVEL PROGRAMS?

ISO's are run independently from the SPRC. Travel programs are designed to be a more competitive addition or alternative to recreation sports. Below is a list of recognized ISO's and Travel programs. More information about these organizations can be found on page 23. Please be advised that in order to participate in certain travel programs, your child must first register for the Recreation league.

RECREATION SOCCER

The Recreation Soccer Program is designed by player development expert Marcus DiBernardo. Coach DiBernardo has consulted for Major League Soccer and European Pro Clubs, and has won multiple men's and women's college national championships. His training methods have been featured by Championship Productions Soccer Series, SiriusXMFC "The Coaching Academy," Trainers Magazine in Holland, and various other professional and amateur clubs around the world.

Players in the Recreation Soccer Program will learn the fundamental techniques of passing, receiving, dribbling, and ball control. The tactical part of training will consist of conditions or rules placed in actual games and simple soccer rondos, cornerstones to player development. Training will also include social aspects where players learn how to operate in a group setting with teammates, listen to instructions, encourage others, and have fun. The most fun part of the program for kids is playing the actual game of soccer, and to keep kids excited and motivated, every training session will start and end with a game, in a practice called, "play, practice, play."

Recreation soccer is often a child's first experience with soccer, and Coach DiBernardo wants children to associate soccer with having fun so that they will grow to love the game. Recreation soccer helps build the skill and knowledge base needed for a child's first club team experience that starts at the U8 level. Recreation soccer is also the entry point to the Scarsdale Soccer Club, a special community that allows your child to develop socially, emotionally, and athletically.

WNC: Little Ferns Nature Program

(drop-off or chaperone)

Explore nature-based learning in the outdoors (80%) and indoor classrooms (20%) at Weinberg Nature Center. Participants learn their ABC's 123's on hikes, with naturalist instructors, while planting gardens, performing STEAM activities on the open green, forest circle or outdoors amphitheater. Children have animal time, do yoga, work the apple cider press, listen to stories about nature and roast marshmallows over an open fire.

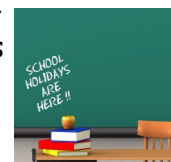

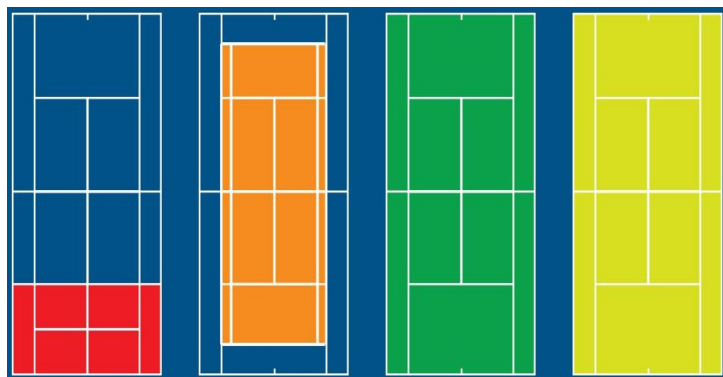

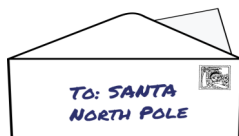

This computerized service, call R U O K, automatically dials a person’s phone at a prearranged time each day to listen for a response. One responds simply by answering the call and hanging up. 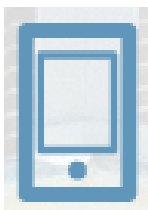

"The File of Life" provides community members with a magnet, featuring a small plastic pocket, that can be stuck on to the refrigerator. The pocket contains a form to list medication and allergy information, emergency contact numbers, and



other important health details. A small sticker of the EMS Star of Life is placed above the doorknob on a participant's front door, indicating to paramedics that The File of Life is on the refrigerator and should be brought to the hospital in an emergency.
